
Transforming Falcon Road Bridge

HomeGrown Plus, a Wandsworth-based not-for-profit organisation providing opportunities to young creatives from non-traditional backgrounds within the built environment.


Speirs Majors, an award-winning international design practice that uses light and darkness to enhance the visual environment. They balance imagination with realism, and passion with pragmatism.


AKT II is a design-led interdisciplinary Engineering consultancy whose contributions to the art and science of design have been recognised by several RIBA Stirling Prizes.

We believe

That in order to transform the Falcon Road bridge a series of micro steps is required. As with Plough, Latchmere, and Queenstown Roads, the division created by the elevated rail lines within the Battersea Tangle demand a deeper look at these spaces and an approach that will empower its residents to re-identify with their community.

Our scheme reconfigures the bus stop at the north end of the bridge making better use of the adjacent green space and improving pedestrian access to the station. We create a "cocoon" passageway under the bridge to protect against pigeon droppings. The art filled cocoon will include acoustic panels, a covered canopy and new lighting to provide a warm inviting space. Green walls will mark each end of the bridge.

We have been working with year 7 and 9 students from the Graveney School and St. John Bosco College empowering them to find their voices. If you have answered one of our questionnaires, or attended our design event, we thank you and look forward to seeing you soon!




Diagram of north "Marker"







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
